- Delays & accidents/ emergencies occur





The GolfMine™ Robot is a safe, efficient, and lucrative alternative to divers in the golf ball retrieval industry.




In-House Technology



- More advanced technology needed


Months 1-6: R&D, Begin advertisement and hiring, employ 5 robot trainers


Expansion Model

 "Dive by feel" - on many occasions more than visuals to find these balls (especially in murky lakes). The claw would have to dig around the bottom of the lake.
